## Clarification Concerning Ultimate Tie Breaker

<u>Situation</u>: Both defensive mans arms are securely tied up and both legs are trapped. Bottom man can not move.

<u>Call</u>: A stalemate may be called as it would be in regulation. This is not to be a quick stalemate like we call in a standup situation. If this happens repeatedly it will still be called a stalemate. Stalling is not to be called in this situation.

**<u>Situation</u>**: Top man breaks bottom man down and sits on the leg with bottom man's foot to his butt.

<u>Call</u>: Wrestling is to continue. This is a ride and should not be called stalling.

<u>Situation</u>: Top man picks bottom mans ankle and drives him forward. They may or may not go out of bounds.

<u>Call</u>: This is a ride, wrestling will continue and no call is to be made.

<u>Comment</u>: Keep in mind that during the ultimate tie breaker, the top man has no obligation to attempt to turn his opponent. If he rides him out he wins.

<u>Remember rules concerning stalling, riding and stalemates</u> <u>differ once the wrestlers go into the ultimate tie breaker.</u>
